





Answers to FAQs regarding recitation competition.

नमस्ते,

Welcome to Samskritam Recitation Competition (Samskrta-kanthapātha-spardhā) annually organized by Samskrita Bharati for the last seven years. One of the reasons for conducting a recitation competition is to introduce original Samskritam texts to children and their parents. We are happy that your children will be taking part in this event. Below are answers to some of the frequently asked questions. If you have other questions, please feel free to send an email to info@samskritabharatiusa.org.

1) How can I get the competition date, time and venue information?

Please refer to our website for center specific information on venue and other details. In Boston, the competition will be held on Saturday, Nov 21st, 2015 at Sadhu Vaswani Center, 1827, Bridge Street, Dracut, MA 01826 between 4.00 PM and 6.30 PM.

2) What is the text selected for the Recitation Competition?

This year, we are introducing bhartRuhari's nītiśathakam. bhartRuhari is a samskritam scholar, who composed vākyapadīya on samskritam grammar and śatakatrayam, comprising three collections of 100 verses each. Of these śatakams, nītišathakam is a popular text that deals with moral conduct and we selected verses from this text to provide all of us, including our children, an opportunity to learn and recite them. For more details on meaning and commentary, please see references section below. The number of verses to be memorized and recited depends on the grade–level of the participant (see below).

3) What are the categories that children can compete in? How many ślokas/verses should they memorize for the competition?

Please see our website for details that are specific to your center. Generally, there are five categories based on grade level (see our website for details since each center may define these categories differently). The number of verses to be memorized depends on each category as follows:

atiśiśugaṇa	(children above 3 years and KG)	5 selected verses
śiśugaṇa	(children in 1 st , 2 nd and 3 rd grades)	9 selected verses
bālagaņa	(children in 4 th , 5 th and 6 th grades)	13 selected verses
yuvagaņa	(7 th , 8 th grade and high school)	16 selected verses
prauDhagana	(adults)	20 selected verses

Please note that the meanings are provided for better understanding only. They are not a requirement for the competition.

4) Would you permit my child to compete in a lower or a higher category? Can my child compete in two categories?

Sorry. We want all children to participate only in their respective grade-level category. Only one entry per child is allowed in the entire competition.

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5) My child knows so many ślokas. Can my child recite these other ślokas?

We are happy that your child knows other ślokas. But for this year's competition, your child should know and recite the selected verses from bhartRuhari's nītiśathakam that we have selected for the child's grade level category. Please see answer to Q3..

6) Should a child memorize all the sūtras?

Children are expected to memorize and recite all the verses in their category (please see answer to Q3 above). Our focus is on participation and recitation competition is just a means to inspire children about learning original Samskritam texts. Therefore, we encourage all children who have registered to participate even if they have not memorized all the verses in their category. For proper pronunciation and meter, please refer to information posted on our website.

7) What are the prizes?

All children will get a participation certificate. Top contenders in each of the five categories will be given bonus prizes. The number of top contenders will depend on the total number of participants in a given category – as a rule of thumb, one top contender (aka bonus prize) trophy for every five participants. PLEASE NOTE – If there are less than five participants in any category, this category may be merged with another category for determining top contenders.

8) When will the certificates and the prizes be distributed?

The results of the competition will be declared after the competition and prizes and certificates would be distributed on the same day at the end of the program.

9) Is there any fee for participation?

This event is free and there is no fee for participation. Samskrita Bharati is a voluntary organization and any donation to support its cause is always welcome. Please visit our website on how you can contribute.

10) How will the participants be judged?

Judging will be based on the following four criteria:

- a) Memory (ability to recite without break, hesitation or confusion)
- b) Pronunciation and clarity
 - i) Diction (crisp and correct pronunciation)
 - ii)Tone and flow (proper meter to be used)
- c) Presentation (posture, mannerism and sincerity of effort)
- d) Overall effect (right attitude and feeling of the participant and its effect on the listener).

11) How will I know the time when my child will be required to recite on competition day?

All participants should arrive at least 15 minutes before the start of the competition and check in with our volunteer at the front desk. However, it is difficult to state exactly when your child's turn will come on the day of the competition. We understand that you and your child(ren) may have other commitments but once registered, we hope that you would make attending recitation competition a priority on the day of competition.

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12) Will there be any practice session that children can attend?

Some centers intend to hold weekly group practice sessions. Please send an email to boston@samskritabharatiusa.org for details.

13) Can parents or other adults participate?

Certainly. Adults can also participate and compete by reciting the prescribed verses from memory. Please refer to Question 3 (or) our website for details regarding the number of verses prescribed for the different categories.

14) Once registered, can a registrant drop out?

Lot of volunteer time and effort goes into planning and putting together such quality programs. We hope that registrants also value and appreciate the effort of the volunteers. Samskritam Classes

For children - We have developed a 3-year program for children age 8 to 12 and conduct children's classes in many centers.
